Judgment

n both the Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed we proclaim that Jesus will come to judge the living and the dead. What does it mean to say that Jesus will be our judge; how does He judge us; what does His judgment look like? When we think of judging, there are probably a couple of different scenarios we think of. We may think of a judge in a courtroom, scrutinizing the defendant, looking down upon him perhaps with distain and passing out a sentence. In this case we would see Jesus before us with a list of our sins, looking down on us and then handing out to us our eternal fate. Some of the end-of-time judgment scenes in Scripture can give us this idea. Scary at best, devastating at worst. Another way to see a judge is perhaps like a judge at some sort of contest from athletics to baking cakes. In this case the judge is not condemning and sentencing someone, but making a decision, uplifting that which is considered the best, giving the others the example to strive for, to help them change their methods so they can improve.

Origen reminds us that "God made the world through the Word and thus the Word is the criterion of measure for all finite things; the standard of beauty and correctness that they are to imitate. The Word by which the world was made is also the Incarnate Word by which the world is remade." Jesus is the coming together of Divinity and humanity and as such shows us what our humanity, at its best, should look like. He is the model of humanity and the manifestation of the God who is love.

It is in this sense that Jesus is judge. He must not be imagined as One arbitrarily passing sentence on humanity or self-righteously pouncing on a sinner. Rather, He should be seen as a reminder of how we are living our life as opposed to His example of how it should be lived. Jesus, as judge, is a conduit of grace, a pathway that opens up to salvation. He is the supreme doctor of the soul and surest means to metanoia. Metanoia means to see beyond ourselves, beyond our own ego, to make Jesus the center of our life and, as St Paul tells us, to take on the mind of Christ.

Jesus' judgment is always for the sake of our salvation; it is bringing to light our sinfulness that is hidden in the dark. It is a teaching from above and hence of healing power. As judge, Jesus continually holds up the example of humanity at its best and at the same time we see how our life measures up to that. His judgment, in fact, is a call to us to see our failings and to make a decision on what we are going to do about it – change or not change. By compelling us to see what we have done with our lives, He opens the door to metanoia while we still have a chance. We see that, in effect, the judgment of Jesus is our judgment upon ourselves. As the Gospels tell us, Jesus did not come into the world to condemn it but to save it. We basically condemn ourselves.

In Jesus' judgment we see where we fall short; we decide what to do – metanoia or not. He offers us forgiveness and salvation; we decide to accept it or not. Jesus's judgment should not scare us, it should give us hope and the desire to change our life and follow Him more closely.


