AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

To the Max

Throughout this season of Lent I was increasingly asked about the personal sacrifices one makes and whether Sundays "count." That is, more than a few young theologians wondered, for example, if the soda or chocolate or video games they gave up for forty days was okay to have on the mini-Easters. Indeed, every Mass is a celebration of the death <u>and</u> resurrection of Jesus.

To be straightforward, my answer is usually ambiguous (see what I did there). The Church presently stipulates rules for abstinence and/or fasting on Ash Wednesday and Fridays in Lent including Good Friday, not on Sundays. However, tradition and family practices generally assume giving something up for the entirety of the season. It seems to me there is a difference between seeking out a loophole and truly enjoying the Lord's Day.

As we gather for Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, we rejoice with alleluias at the new life gifted to us by the rising from the dead of Christ. The "day" is celebrated over an octave inclusive of the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday. The Easter Season stretches for fifty days through the Ascension to Pentecost. The emphasis here is that season of the resurrection is given more weight than any other liturgical time.

Maybe this is an opportunity to introduce the practice of doing something more for Easter. For, what we commemorate is a Christian passover – making present the salvation *from* sin and death *for* holiness and true life. The Paschal Mystery, our Easter Faith, calls for a celebration to the max!
