

DUST, MILESTONES, AND THE PASSAGE OF TIME

One steps into the same river twice and different waters flow on them." – Heraclitus of Ephesus

This week marks my fifth year as parish business manager here at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart. A somewhat arbitrary milestone is nevertheless a good opportunity to reflect on the events, accomplishments, and failures of the past five years, remind myself of the purpose and passions which guide my decisions now, and look ahead to the next five years. This has been a chance for me to recall my priorities and guiding principles amidst the disorientation of the pandemic and construction projects that simultaneously seem like merely yesterday and somehow ages ago.

In my reflections and prayers, I have pondered with gratitude about some of the amazing things that have happened here at the parish, in the school, and in my own personal life. I think it is fair to say that "growth" has been a consistent theme... When I took this role, my daughter Magdalene had just been born. Now Annie and Charles have joined our family as well and Maggie is halfway through her Pre-K year at SHCS. The parish and school have likewise grown, and even more broadly our beloved city of Pensacola has been considerably transformed since 2019.

Though the Church provides a wise liturgical framework for helping us find meaning in the passage of time, I must admit that it is the important milestones in my children's lives that often serve as the numbers on the clock of my memories. What stands out to me are that so many of these milestones have happened here at the Cathedral, in the context of the sacramental life and a community of friends and family who come together each week around the altar. I recall so many beautiful moments like baptisms and first communions, CYSL championship games, school projects and accomplishments, and so many birthday parties – and no matter what the celebration was that week (or what international event occurred), my family gathers each week with this community of people and shares communion together. There is something so incredibly grounding about tethering oneself to a community and growing together. There is change and consistency, love and loss, newness and familiarity, struggle and joy... and yet at the center of all the change is Christ and his Church in the tangible reality of this parish, these people, these moments in time and space.


There is a humbling irony to having these grand recollections at the beginning of Lent. The ashes scratched on my forehead on Ash Wednesday remind me that I am dust, and to dust I shall return. But we are also told that God counts each hair on our head and knows every grain of sand on the shore. This balance of the reality of our cosmic insignificance with a profound importance of even the tiniest parts of our lives is a great mystery of our faith. Thank you for allowing me and my family to share these great and small moments with you, and please know of my prayers for each of you in this parish family.



Fasting & Abstinence

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
- For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

THE ARITHMETIC OF LENT

The Season of Lent is typically characterized as a somber time of prayerful repentance and sorrow. These days are marked by the discipline of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

It could be easy to forget about the purpose of Lent. That is, we are called to conversion that we may participate in the Resurrection at Easter. In short, we prepare to return to our friendship with God.

Our tendency is to think only about what we are giving up for Lent (SUBTRACT). More and more are keen to what we can do more of during Lent (ADD).

The result is that we can increase in faith, hope, and love (MULTIPLY).

May we enter into this Lenten Season of sacrifice (SUBTRACT) and self-giving (ADD), and allow the Holy Spirit to increase his grace in us (MULTIPLY)...that we may share the gift of friendship with God.




