

Faith, Hope and Love

Faith, hope and love are the three theological virtues. A virtue being the firm habit and disposition to do good. These theological virtues are gifts from God. We use the word faith in many ways, from our religious affiliation to our Christian denomination or to mean belief. Faith is the virtue in us that corresponds to God's opening of the door to the Heavenly and spiritual dimension. We can grasp many things and truths of this world, but we can never really grasp the inner life of God. Original sin was that humanity wanted to grasp at and take to itself the inner life and mind of God. But we can't. The inner life of God can only be received as a grace, a gift, granted to us by God.Faith itself is a gift by which we open ourselves to receive and accept the gift of God in our lives.

Hope is the act of aspiring to a good that transcends any of the goods available within this world. It is born in us only when God invades our soul and changes it. The desire for an eternal good becomes possible only when we see that there is something much better beyond what this world has to offer. Hope is that aching desire for a good that we can't truly understand, it is that the soul has been raised by hope to a dimension beyond that imaginable by anything or anyone on earth.

Love is the greatest of these three theological virtues because love is the very life of God. Faith opens the dimension of eternity, hope makes us desire it, but love allows us to participate in it even now while still on earth. In Heaven, faith will fade away because we will see God and be in His presence. Hope will no longer be necessary because we will have attained what we had hoped for. But love will remain because love is what Heaven is. The dynamic of the Divine life is the act of being with and for the other. Love is the willing of the good of the other. Therefore God is love. This virtue of love is a participation in the Divine manner of being and acting. When we allow God and His love to invade our soul, it will not overwhelm or undermine our earthly life, it enhances it.What happens is that our life is transfigured and that transfiguration of our life is the effect of love working its way into the very depth of our being.

Faith opens the door to eternal life with God. Hope makes us want to go through the door. On the other side of the door is the pure, unimaginable love of God waiting to draw us in and surround us forever.

- The readings of the Mass follow the Year A lectionary. You may notice at the Sunday 9:30am Mass a change in the scriptures and homily.





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will take up The Catholic Relief Services Collection on March 9/10. Your support for this collection provides emergency assistance to victims of war and natural disasters; assists migrants and refugees who need housing, education, and specialized legal assistance; and supports travelers and others whose livelihoods require special pastoral support to access the sacraments. In addition to aiding those with immediate needs, your support helps long-term efforts to build peace in regions that have been affected by decades of conflict—such as the Korean peninsula.

Although active fighting in the Korean War ceased with an armistice agreement in 1953, a lasting peace has never been established. In the intervening 70 years, relations among North Korea, South Korea, and the United States have grown in complexity, especially with the increasing recent threat of nuclear weapons. The Catholic Church stands against the scourge of war and the proliferation of nuclear weapons without exception, as a world mission and voice to build lasting peace in place of war. The Catholic Institute of Northeast Asia Peace (CINAP) was founded in 2015 to strengthen communications among the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Korea, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Japan, and the Holy See. In 2017, CINAP hosted its first international conference, the Catholic Korea Peace Forum.

After several years of virtual meetings due to pandemic restrictions, the sixth annual Catholic Korea Peace Forum gathered in October 2022 in Washington, DC, bringing together church leaders from North and South Korea and the United States—including the USCCB's International Justice and Peace (IJP) committee chairman—as well as experts, scholars, and government officials from the United States, South Korea, and Japan. As co-organizer of the Forum, IJP was integral to the Church's mission to pray and work for just and lasting peace on the Korean peninsula. This crucial work is made possible with the support IJP receives from The Catholic Relief Services Collection.
